





In the spotlight



Kali had just arrived as a freshman at the university from her hometown of Sandy, Utah; Eric was a junior and a local of the area. They first met on a double date—only they were on the date with different people. A year later, however, they started dating each other, and five years later they were engaged.

How HE PROPOSED: Eric proposed to Kali during a romantic dinner at a restaurant in downtown Seattle.

BRIDAL SHOWER THEME:

"Loving you is a piece of cake!"
Following a "cake" theme, the

BACHELOR PARTY: Eric and his friends (many of them from out of town) went to Park City the night before the wedding and partied at Prime Steak House. Wedding

PLACE: Log Haven Restaurant, in Milkreek Canyon in Salt Lake City DATE: April 5, 2008

THE BRIDE WORE: a Monique Lhuillier strapless gown in silk and lace with a gold sash, a silk wrap, metallic ballet flats, and a custom-designed vintage 1920s headpiece made of feathers and fabric.

THE GROOM WORE: a black tuxedo with a black vest and a skinny black tie.

BRIDESMAIDS: Lindsay Barnett (maid of honor), Chelsea Bennett, Jennifer Sorensen, Kara Corliss and Erica Corliss. Bridesmaids wore satin empire ballgowns with chiffon halters and a ruched sash in apple red.

GROOMSMEN: Steve Corliss (best man), Chris Wadsworth, Jordan Wadsworth, Ryan Corbaley, Brian Britt and Mikey Britt. The groomsmen wore black tuxedos with black vests and skinny black ties to match the groom.

WEDDING SONG: For the processional, the bride's brothers played a classical arrangement of "How Great Thou Art" on their guitars. For the first dance, the couple danced to "At Last," by Etta James.

Reception

PLACE: Log Haven, same as the ceremony

WEDDING MUSIC: a DJ provided a mix of dance music and standard wedding songs to get the crowd dancing.

MENU: Appetizers: salmon, cucumber and cream cheese sushi rolls. "We love sushi, and Log Haven was nice enough to make special rolls for us," says Kali. Dinner: mixed field greens with choice of Champagne vinaigrette or creamy gorgonzola













dressing; freshly baked rolls; soy ginger chicken with shiitake mushroom sauce and mashed potatoes; grilled vegetable platter and a display of seasonal fruits. CAKE: Three-tiered chocolate cake covered with white chocolate curls and topped with an old-fashioned cake-topper that resembled the couple.

COLORS: Champagne, cardinal red and deep pink.

THEMES: The bride tried to incorporate elements of the Northwest throughout the reception, including the salmon sushi rolls and the Almond Roca candy favors.

FLOWERS: The bridal bouquet was a mix of white roses, white lilies and pale pink peonies.

DÉCOR ELEMENTS: Red, pink and clear crystals hung from the candles lining the aisle, and

At the reception, the bride and groom put up a custom-made wooden sign with their names painted on it. Dozens of candles and red roses decorated the dining area, and red-and-pink rose arrangements tied with gold

The bride and groom's mothers cut out hundreds of tulle circles and ribbons to make satchels, and the bride designed tags

that matched the design of the wedding invitation with the couple's name and wedding date on them. The tags were attached to the satchels, which were filled with Almond Roca candy (a Northwest original manufactured in Tacoma, where the couple first met).
